## **TP-CASTT PoetryAnalysis**

TITLE: Consider the title and make a prediction about what the poem is about. "The Road Not Taken" by Robert Frost someone will make a choice not to take a road, PARAPHRASE: Translate the poem line by line into your own words on a literal level. Look for complete thoughts (sentences may be inverted) and look up unfamiliar words. Stanza 1 = speaker is hiking/walk in the woods alove. H's fall. He was on one path when it because 2 paths Stanza 2: He licked down both trails, they both look good. Stanta 3: If i go this way - I could do the other trail another day

CONNOTATION: Examine the poem for meaning beyond the literal. Look for figurative language, imag-ery, and

sound elements. Walk symbolizes inner journey.

Imagery: "yellow wood" "grassy and wanted wear" "trodden black"

Rhyme Scheme: ABAAB Rhyme Schene: ABAAB Alliteration "wanted wear" Anaphora: "way leads on to way" ATTITUDE/TONE: Notice the speaker's tone and attitude. Humor? Sarcasm? Awe? Speaker's tone is reflective and remeniscent, In lines 13-15, the speaker says he'll save one path for anotherday but doubts he'll ever be back, lines 16-17 "I shall be telling with v. 19-20 After pondering, he makes thinking-chossing a decision "I took the path less between two choices. traveled and it's made all the difference." TITLE: Examine the title again, this time on an interpretive level. I see the walk in the woods as a metaphor for our journey in life. That we will have choices and use need to take time to decide the best path. The valle in the woods symbolizes our life's journey, Enjoy the journey. THEME: Briefly state in your own words what the poem is about (subject), then what the poet is saying about the Life is a journey.
